## **Acorn Class**

In history we have been learning about what school was like in the past, and what it is like in the present.

Having to sit on a cold wooden bench and 5 people to a small seat. Having a cold classroom with a small fire at the front of class.

Acorns were excited about looking and learning about the picture of the children and staff who attended Hatch Beauchamp 150 years ago. To which we then re-enacted the photo the same way.

We have also been looking at computers and how they have changed over the years. Over the next few weeks we will be making flipbooks, showing the story by changing the picture little by little with each page.

Acorns are thrilled about learning taekwondo in PE. We have been learning Inner block, lower block, upper Block, front Kicks, turning kicks, and we will also be doing Axe kicks. (inner Crescent & Outer Crescent)

All of these are performed safely on a kick target pad.

We have learnt some Korean words in the process, as Taekwondo originates from South Korea. We have also learnt how to correctly hold the pads & work in small groups, and to always finish with bowing to show respect & to say thank you to your opponent.

Ms Ward also spoke with the children about how TKD is a Olympic and a Paralympic sport.

Ms Ward is not only our school sport's coach, she is also a qualified TKD instructor. She has been teaching TKD for 19 years, and is graded a 5th Dan black belt, so it is being taught in the right way.

A quick reminder that PE is on a Monday and a Friday, please ensure your child has their PE kit. Please also ensure Reading books and Reading records books are in school on a Thursday to be changed over.
